Student's Right to Know Disclosure *Completion Rates*

The Student Right-to-Know Act requires an institution that participates in any student financial assistance program under Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (as amended) to disclose information about graduation rates to current and prospective students.

The **2014 Cohort Completion Rate** for first-time students in full-time programs at All-State Career School -Baltimore is **63.2%**. This rate is based on the 487 students who started their program between September 1, 2014 and August 31, 2015. Of the 487 students who started their program, 308 students completed their program of study within 150% of normal completion time. Please refer to the institution's catalog for the normal completion time of each program. The above data excludes 9 students whose last date of attendance was less than 30 days after the first class day of their program that was greater than one academic year in length and students whose last date of attendance was less than 15 days after the first class day of their program that was less than or equal to one academic year in length.

The combined **2014 Cohort Completion Rate** for first-time students in full-time programs at the campuses attached to the Office of Post-Secondary Education Identification (OPEID) number 034933 is **63.0%**. The OPEID number is comprised of All-State Career School – Baltimore and All-State Career Pittsburgh. This rate is based on the 899 students who started their program between September 1, 2014 and August 31, 2015. Of the 899 students who started their program, 566 students completed their program of study within 150% of normal completion time. Please refer to the institution's catalog for the normal completion time of each program. The above data excludes 10 students whose last date of attendance was less than 30 days after the first class day of their program that was greater than one academic year in length and students whose last date of attendance was less than 15 days after the first class day of their program that was less than or equal to one academic year in length.

- 1) Source Document is the Master Student Listing Report from the Campus Vue student data management system.

Students who did not identify their first-time status were assumed first-time students per guidance provided by the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). As a result, it is possible the data above may also include non-first time students.
- 3) Full-time programs were determined using the full-time definition as defined by the Financial Aid Office.
- 4) We have elected not to report transfer-out rates because our school's mission does not include providing substantial preparation for students to enroll in another eligible institution without completing or graduating from our programs.
